the proceedings taken and testimony presented—along with briefs to the three judge court, we think that if the court will consider those that we have cited the requisite treaties and other acts of congress bringing this case before this court and giving the court ample jurisdiction, not only of the person but of the place.

THE COURT: Except one little item. There is nothing in any of the treaties you cited that gave the Indian tribes a right to hunt and fish. Hone of the treaties. None of the tribes indigenous to Oklahoma have a treaty that gives them the right to hunt and fish. If you have anything to the contrary I want to hear it.
