the establishment of the monetary amount is not necessary, but for the purposes of the record, if the court intends to base its ruling, in whole or in part, in that amount we would like to have an opportunity to at least introduce, at sometime, some evidence as to that so it cannot be ruled against us that we just failed to do it.

THE COURT: Nell, Mr. Ringold, you asked me if the court intends to weigh that. What option does the court have? I don't know of any option the court has but to consider the \$10,000.

MR. RINGOLD:

Well, I would say,

too, --

THE COURT: Well, you failed on the first one, certainly. I see no conflict at all. I just got through saying that. All I asked you to do was give me the name of the treaty.

MR. RINGOLD:

We wish we could.

THE COURT:

All right. So

there is none. All right.

So, I must look at something for jurisdiction and I haven't heard anything yet establishing jurisdiction in this court.

MR. RINGOLD: Well, we have an honest difference of opinion on that particular phase of it.
