'(What about the Otoes--is there a name for the Otoes?) Well, it just have to be Oto, or "old toe!" Or, "Your toe is old." (laughs) (I have a name here I'll try to pronounce-- wω sóhunω --?); wω soohuni.n ę nω -- wω soohunω That's Otoes. (What does that mean?) Well, that's "Oto" -- wasoohuning n (Say that once more.) www soohunw (And another one was longer?) I said wω soohuni.n e nω'. I said, "Oto Men" (What does the first part of that mean?) Oh, www sooh -- is you know, when you clean your gun-- (making back and forth motion). (What about the Caddo Indians?) tw ni.bae0i That means "Big nostrils." (What about the Wichita Indians?) I wouldn't know. (One name you gave me quite a while ago means something like "Lot of Timber Men". That's--what tribe is Bessie? (Pause) Creek. Creek Indians. hwwwhw. aeti.nen Thats Creek Indians--"Timber Men." (What about the Potawatomis?) ກຜ xww hiei ' -- that means "Watermelon." (Why would they call them that?) I don't know why they call them "watermelon" but that's Potawatomi. Joe Neely's tribe. nώ ώ xùwúhùt --that's one man. (What about the Kiowa-Apaches--do you have a name for them?) Kiowa-Apaches? (You remember that Big Ben Chaletsin -- what tribe he was?) You know I don't know. Really, I don't know. (What about the Tonkawa Indians?) Well, all I know is Tonkawa.
