(What about the Poncas?)

No. I don't know what their Indian name is.

(What about the Navajoes or any of those?)

wó.wúnaééi'

(What does that mean?)

Oh, it means--how would you put it--when they all gather and they're hungry.

(What about the Pueblos--do you have a name for them?)

hó.ééitwóhó'wxtwóéi'

(What does that mean?)

It means they got their braid back of the head.

(And the Shoshone?)

sósóní'í

(What does that mean?)

Oh, you know, some kind of an insect--you know--like there always be some little snakes that always have stripes. That's the ones--sósóní

(What do the Oklahoma Arapahoes call the northern Arapahoes?)

bó'w'cíné nò' That's just like "Red String". Yeah.

(What do they call you?)

nówúné nò' -- "Southern Men" they always call us.

(Have you ever heard of a tribe of Indians they called the "Row-of-Lodge" Indians?)

No. I just know Jesse Rowledge!

(What about any other Apache group--like the Geronimo Apaches--do you have a name for them?)
