(Would that be a stone arrow point--?)

Yeah.

(Are there other tribes you have names for that I haven't thought about?)

Shawnee--what do they call them? (Pause) I don't know. I forgot.

(What about the Poncas?)

No. I don't know what their Indian name is.

(What about the Navajoes or any of those?)

wo.wunaéei

(What does that mean?)

Oh, it means--how would you put it--when they all gather and they're hungry.

(What about the Pueblos--do you have a name for them?)
hω geitω hω ω xtω ei

(What does that mean?)

It means they got their braid back of the head.

(And the Shoshone?)

sosoni i

(What does that mean?)

Oh, you know, some kind of an insect--you know--like there always be some little snakes that always have stripes. That's the ones--sosoni

(Have you ever heard of a tribe of Indians they called the "Row-of-Lodge" Indians?)

No. I just know Jesse Rowlodge!

(What about any other Apache group--like the Geronimo Apaches--do you have a name for them?)
