Mr. Wheeler: Well, me and him same age. (Yeah.) Mr. Wheeler: We was born on the twenty-second of July. (Uh.) Mr. Wheeler: Yeah. (Ethel told me it was twenty-first.) Mr. Wheeler: Huh? (Ethel told me she thought it was the twenty-first.) Mr. Wheeler: No, it's twenty-second. So, I told the draft--oh, I guess, I could have told them, "They didn't have no record at the agency." They didn't have no record. Only thing they had was I was born 1902. (Yeah.) Mr. Wheeler: Maybe, I was born before that. I don't know. (laughter) -Government might be cheating me. (laughter) Yes, so, they're going to do that, Wichitas. (Yeah.) Hr. Wheeler: I don't know. I reckon we're supposed to have that meeting on the third, third of August. (Yeah.) Mr. Wheeler: And I want to go over here. (Yeah.) Mr. Wheeler: Red Barn. (Yeah.) Mr. Wheeler: I think that's where they're going to have it too. (Yeah, second, third, and fourth.) Mr. Wheeler: Yeah. (You're going to camp out there?)
