MR. GEIKOUMAH'S GRANDFATHER:

Mrs. H.: Tell him about your Grandfather Hikehesehkeh (?) and his Comanche girl. How he got his name. Tell him that. This is all going to go down on the record at Norman. So you want that written down on the record. So tell him about your Grandpa.

Mr. G.: Well, Grandpa Hikehesehkeh was born in 1700. That's the one I'm going to tell you. He was born 1700. And the way I found out is that I join a different clan, different company. He was seventeen in 1700 and 17 he joined a clan, a different clan. And he that's the time he was coming growing up and you know, go away on a war expedition. And he was a big chief. He was a warrior. He's brave and he's a medicine man. Yeah, Grandpa is a big medicine man. And he goes and fight to kill his enemy. "They try to kill me," he says, "I got to kill them." And in 1817 he joined he going back down there to the war expedition with a bunch of Kiowas down there. That's customary that's the way they do. They go and line up down there and he says, "A hard time I had." He says, "I don't run. I'm a brave." Grandpa is pretty brave. He is a big chief. Heidsick, heidsick, and his Kiowa name is....He says it's Plume Lance. He says, "I got medicine." He says, "That medicine is pretty powerful." He said, "Nothing gonna kill me." He says, "So..he said, "One day in my time, " he said, "They attack, I believe they're Navajo." He says, "I had my horse stuck down there in a mud hole. I pull him out and I hear the people up here on the hill. They holler. So I went over there and I got down there." And grandpa say, "Hey you fellows have you done anything?" "Oh, no." They said, "That man is pretty bad. If he say he will get you, you better watch out. He is pretty good shot. He hasn't killed d
