look for 'em. They look for 'em Indians. At that time, why, they had soldiers around there somewhere's.

(Where at Ft. Cobb?)

No, I don't know where's at. But anyhow, somewhere. They was coming down to Ft. Sill I guess. Wagon's...(\*NOTE: These wagons belonged to the soldiers.)

And them wild Indians saw that wagons along there on the read. Well, they kill them all.

(Did the Indians kill the soldiers?)

They kill them all, --- them soldiers. They got the mules and they bok in the ' wagons and they find a sack of flour...bacon, everything to eat. And they got that sack of flour and poured it on them fellows. That was dead body and they poured on 'em flour. At that time they go all ; them wild Indians down there at Ft. Sill. They had a court. And that commander --- I don't know his name. But anyhow, he's a big commander out there. He had them wild Indians there. And they (\*refers to Indians) killed them soldiers up there. "Wheres the mules?" (asks the commander) They want them mules back. (Wife interrupts: If they give their mules back they'll be all right. ah...) Yeah. There's a white person. He was an Indians scout. I don't know his name. Indian, White, he talk good Indian. He talk to them Indians. They have a court. He say "Don't tell." They gonna put you in deep place. He told them Indians don't tell who did. He's a white person and he jump up and says, "I'm the one. I kill all them soldiers out there." They call him \_\_\_\_\_, ah --- I like this way, White Bear. They got him and those other big chiefs...they all chiefs but this other jumps up and say I done that. Ah...that White Bear, they give him a life time. Prisoner.....he died there. I.don't know where. That's way they got him punish. Now today, we all know what's law. That's the white man way. We learn it from White man. We are talking in white man now. I'm an old Indian. I learn it from white man--teacher.
