scared and they ran back to the house, and they said when they got back to the house they was having a war. fighting among each other. So this girl said she ran into one of their houses and was standing near the door behind the door, and her little feet was sticking out under the door and then this man seen this feet there, and why he seen this girl standing there and he drag, her out and tie her to the horse and then he brought her back. And then they got way back over here and they lost their horses. And then they told them for so much horses they give them the children, you know. So these men gave her back. Twelve or eight horses. I think for that girl. Said she was verry little then to think about it, but his father always tell us.

(Now his father was a Kiowa? And his grandfather was a Kiowa, but he married a girl who was captive of the Comanches?) Yes. (From Texas?)

Yes:

(Did the Kiowas ever go on raids like the Comanches?)

I don't think so. I never heard anybody say so. Just one person I heard. It's this Goombi bunch you know. That old lady...that's in that book you know. She's the mother of this Goombi and her daughter so light complexion they look like white people. I used to hear stories, you know. I've kept that in my mind all the time you know.

(Did your grandmother ever tell you any stories?)

No, she never did tell me any stories about. but I just heard them stories from his father (Husband's) when he was telling us he always tell us to put it in our heads, you know so we might have to talk to someboyd, you know like you're doing now. But I don't know my father's birthplace and mother's. I never hear anybody say.
