

bunchle (carbuncle) you know. Maybe it just ruined my breast and maybe I had to put it on a bottle. Three, four, I had bottle babies. And it takes money. It costs money to raise them. That time they don't use any other kind of milk but that condenser milk. That's what I raised my kids on. Just warm water and about three teaspoons of that milk and just shake it up and give it to em. My mother had ten children and nine of us was living, and ah, now just three of us, Sisters and a brother.

ALLOTMENTS:

(I would like to ask you questions about your land allotment. I don't know that much about the way in which this was done. I was reading in the book which you loaned me about the Indians here being placed on reservations and then given their lands. Could you tell me more about this were they Indians placed in particular areas?)

Yea, certain places you know. They allot so much. Well, these older people got their land first. In allotments you know. They put em all up you know, like now and they give it to them, and then after that later on I think these younger people got theirs. Where I got mine. You know ah, I guess they told them that they was going to divide some more land to these younger children. So my father went and got three of them. Three allotments for us and that time we was just three of us born then. And I must be about two years, no I must be about..my other sister must be about two years old and the other one must be about two years old and then I was about four years old I guess when they..I was born in 1901 and that's the time I think they got this allotment. And that's where I got mine. That's where we got ours then.
