see General Pratt used to come there and talk to us on various things, so he would speak of our patriotism and so on, so many of our boys just went right on in and they made officers without having to go through all that you know officers training.

(Did you have any other jobs?)

Oh yes. I worked as a baker.

(As a baker?)

Uhuh. Up at the school.

(Did you get paid for that?)

Oh yes.

(Did you work anywhere else?)

Well, I worked out as a practical nurse half the time, because it wasn't you know in fact I delivered about 15 babies all by myself.

(Would people come after you?)

Yes. They would come after me because I had to ready at most any time.

Those were the days that it didn't require for any mother to be in the hospital like they do now.

(Did you ever take any work at school that along the lines of being a practical nurse?)

Oh yes . : Uhuh.

(Did you ever have a special course for that?)

Yes, we had because you could take any division. I always answered as a dispensery nurse. When I was in Phoenix and was working at the sanitorium I worked as a dispensery nurse. See, we had to check this was a tubercular sanitorium. And if any of the patients came up with any fever above normal well then we had to watch and put them to bed. You'd have to watch and keep charts. And then file them and then report them
