(Was there a certain length of time that the Caddos didn't do this dance?)

Oh, they've always danced it, but the ceremonial part we didn't carry on. They danced it just as a you know, social get-together. But it never was carried out like it was carried out this time.

(When did that happen?) When did the people decide to do that?)

Well, it was after the war.

(After the Second World War?)

Uhuh. After the Second World War.

(Did the people just get together and talk about that and decide to bring it..?)

Uhuh. Yes.

(Did they ever have a meeting for it?)

Oh, yes. They had a meeting up at the council. But it before the meeting and voted on it.

(There were some other questions I wanted to ask you about. One of them was, did it have any religious meaning to it? Did it have any religious meaning in the past?)

Uh, well, to a certain degree with the older people, but we dance it more for you know, social purposes, except for when that tobacco is laid on the drum. Then it's sort of religious because that tobacco leads it I think.

(There were some more questions that I wanted to ask you that I didn't
