Among the Osages. Yes. But I really couldn't say anything about that only just down to Claremore camp and down to Barnsdall. But he was dead then when that originated down there.

(Barnsdall?)

Un-huh: This Griffin was the one that helped down there. My father seemed to have something to do about that, 'cause that's where we were living when all that come out, after he died.

(Barnsdall?)

Un-huh:

(To Ed, in the background — "Well Ed, your folks belonged at — To Barnsdall too, didn't they? Was your father and grandfather — Were they active in the Church there?")

Ed: My grandfather was _____ (?).

(Do you remember Ed's grandfather being there in the Church?)

Yes. Mostly his father — He was just a young man. But his grandfather too. Seemed like his grandfather took more to the war dances. His grandfather did.
