got up and walked out. We didn't say anything. And then we went and got some from this preacher and this preacher say, "He sould keep some for emergencies like that: He should not talk that way to you all,"

1That's what he said.

(Is this the way most of the Cheyennes feel about the clinic?)
Yes.

(Do most of them go to the clinic or hot?)

Most of them...I go to Dr. Rupe. He gets paid for that, about the same as this other doctor. This other one...we don't harldly go to him.

(How long has this Dr. Rupe been in the area?)

Oh, I don't know, but I think he's lived here most of the time.

Because his dad was a hired man somewhere out in the country.

(And most of the Cheyennes like him?)

Yes. He is a nice doctor. Let's see...if you go to his office and it's not on the clinic day, if you go to his office, if it's an emergency, he won'd send you no bill. See, they have to go back to Dr. Rupe, and if you need penicillin or something like that, well he'ld do it. He's not like this other doctor. Most of them don't like this doctor. 'cause we don't go back to him unless' the doctor s not there, you know.'

(What do you think the doctor at the clinic could do to make the Cheyennes any happier?)

If he just would help us...if we go to where he's working at, welf, our clinic day's Monday and Friday, and then see sometimes there are people that have no way to get around you know to get in town for the
