(How long did they nurse the children?)

Well, as long..as long as they could you know. Of course a lot of times they got another child coming you know and they have to wean to baby. I'll say sometimes I ll go by myself, I'll go by my children when they're born. I don't have my period for about two years. And when two years come, well I just..when I have my period, you know once or twice and here I go again. Every two years I bear a child. Yeah, that's the way I was going, but other's I hear they just go eight months and here they're caught again with baby.

(Were there any special restrictions on a girl while she was having her period?)

They uh, they don't do nothing that I know of. They just go on, but we don't want no man to see us with our periods, you know, because we have to sneak around. Yeah, that's all we could do. Of course, according to other tribes you know, I don't know what they do, but that's what we do, the Kiowa Apaches. We just go on. When four days come, well we're fairly over. That's what we do.

CARE OF BABY:

After the baby is born who generally takes care of it and raises and teaches it things?)

I don't know too much of that, but it's just what I hear that way back you know when men always take a horse, extra horse when he's going to hunt buffalos or deer and sometimes his wife go along with him and he hunt buffalos or deer and sometimes his wife go along with him and hunt and hunt and whenever he butcher meat the deer, the
