BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

G. W. Levite was about 75 years of age at the time of this interview. He was one of two of the first graduates of Apache High School in 1909. After graduation he worked in his father's store and has been partner and owner of that same store since that time. The Indians bought most of their supplies at his store and Mr. Levite still remembers government rules and regulations concerning purchases made by Indians and penalties for disregarding rules. He is still very active and alert with a very good memory. The Comanches, Kiowas, Kiowa-Apaches, and Ft. Sill Apaches have been customers of his for over fifty years.
