

Mr. T.: I found something in one of the publications that the Department of Welfare claims to indicate to the County, where it indicated that the Department of Welfare will be Bureau of Indian Affairs. Relationship with other, like, like Family Services and Relief under 1314.1 Child. DPW Reissued 5-4-5. And at 2 in the 4th paragraph the last sentence reads: "It is, therefore, essential each Indian case be cleared with the respective re - some five of the Cherokee or Muskogee areas." And that is in reference to the relationship with some. And it appeared to be, at least, that there is some doubt as to the responsible agency is, whether it is the Department of Welfare or the Bureau of Indian.

Reference: Would you care to comment Mrs. Ewing on the issue as the responsibility determining the eligibility for assistance? Could you clarify this?

Mrs. E.: Well, we have our policies to go by and if a client does not comply with them they are ineligible and we make a decision as to why they are or are not.

Mr. T.: That is the county department of Public Welfare?

Mrs. E.: Yes.

Mr. T.: We are still in the area of coming to the issue and we are not testifying to things under oath, are we?

Reference: Thus correct.

Mr. T.: Now we see if I do understand what seems to be set here. I think it is set by the Delaware County Welfare Department that the responsibility for all decisions on all recipients in all public assistance cases is the responsibility solely of the Delaware County Welfare Department.

Reference: Is anything said as this being a part of the State Department of Public

Mr. T.: I'm just trying to paraphrase Mrs. Ewing's statement, and I'm really not sure what is what she means to say.

Mrs. E.: Well, we are governed by the State Office.

Mr. T.: And with the qualification, do I understand you to mean that your decision, whose matters is one in which you are controlled by the Oklahoma Welfare is guided by them?

Mrs. E.: We are part of them, yes, they are the guide.

Reference: I see Mr. Delaney standing back there and we might call him up and see if he can contribute anything to identifying the issue here.

In identifying the issue here Mr. Delaney has raised the question in part as I understand it, who is responsible for closing Mr. O'Neil's case, the Oklahoma Department of Public Welfare or the Bureau of Indian Affairs, or the County Department of Public Welfare in particular?

Mr. D.: The Delaware County Office takes the action and the basis of the action is the policy of the Oklahoma Department of Public Welfare and the Commission complies with Federal and State Policies. The Bureau of Indian had nothing to do with this other than notifying us of Mr. O'Neil's case and recommending the continuation of hardship basis that the action to close case was the Oklahoma Department of Public Welfare Policy's execution. It is done on a local level but it is State Policy being carried out.
