Mr. P.: The land that we talked about that could be irrigated, is that within the 62 acres that the Bureau has offered for sale?

Mr. O.: Well, not all of it.

Mr. P.: How much of that 40 is in that 62?

Mr. O.: Well you might say about 30 in the other reserved and about, I guess you might say almost 30 of the other. I'd judge.

Mr. P.: So there'd be 30 acres in the 62 that the Bureau offered for sale?

Mr. O.: Yeah.

Mr. P.: Is that what you wanted?

Reference: Very good. Now, in talking about the land that was farmed in the early 20's and he share-cropped after, I wonder if you recall for about how many years you worked this land on a share-crop basis after you quit farming it yourself? And was that the bottom land?

Mr. O.: Well, it was hardly, mostly bottom land and part of that was upland too. I p... continued I guess. We share-crop it 7 or 8 years, there was quite a bit of drainage here, see, and I got discouraged and quit and went to work, carpenter work, and
