Mrs. P.: Yes.

Mr. T.: So that he sold the 107 acres and then had to use the money to buy back property that was not tax exempt?

Mrs. P.: As far as he knows it is.

Mr. T.: That's all I have to say.

Referee: Two additional witnesses, Mrs. Fannie Wolf and Mr. J. B. Tanner. Again, Mrs. Kitchitt explained the oath, so if you will raise your right hand I'll administer the oath at this time.

Mr. T.: Your name is Fannie Wolf?

Mrs. W.: Yes.

Mr. T.: And your address is?

Mrs. P.: Route 1, Maysville, Arkansas.

Mr. T.: How old are you Mrs. Wolf?

Mrs. P.: 69.

Mr. T.: At one time did you have tax exempt and restricted land?

Mrs. P.: She has part of it.

Mr. T.: How much did she have originally?

Mrs. P.: She didn't have a lot of land but her husband did. She doesn't know for sure how much but it was over 100 acres.

Mr. T.: And that was her husband's land? And he died?

Mrs. P.: Yes, he died in 1942.

Mr. T.: And did they have children?

Mrs. P.: Yes, they had 4.

Mr. T.: And at the time that Mr. Wolf died, how many were there, still over the 100 acres?

Mrs. P.: Yes.
