(Who are the grandparents that raised you? What ere their names?)

The grandparents, my mother names uh-Four Wife. And my other grandparent name is uh-Bah-page (spelled phonetically). Uh-huh. Yeah.

MORE ABOUT COMANCHE NAMES

(Oh, something else about, I was curious about, that I wanted to ask you about - did all the Comanche names you know like (says three Comanche names) all them. The "bitty" name, does that have a meaning in Comanche?)
Yeah.

(What does that mean? Just that part.)

Well, in a way that - Poffabitty, it's - see he jumps around.

Uh-huh. He just jumps, jumps around, you know.

And then the others whatever their name, it starts with, why it still jumping.

(Like the ((Comanche name))?)
