I rode up there and they let me stay. / (not clear for next two sentences.) --down there about Denison, Texas--/ (On the train?) They decided to come back and get the rest/of 'em.

(On the train?)

Yeah.

(Loaded with --)

--couldn't pull it. (not clear for about two sentences.) Yeah, down there about Denison, Texas and then come back and get the rest of them. From Dallas, we ride--could ride back down there. We went to San Antonio then.

Yeah. And we got there about 7 or 8 o'clock that morning. Rode all night. Then, we sign up and get out (not clear) ~-said well, (not clear). Then they send me to Cavalry then-- (next several sentences not clear) We went down there in Houston, Texas. In 1913 it started.

(1913.)

Germany--start--France and Germany started it first. And they went ahead and started on (not clear) -- cause a war down there and they finally (not clear) United States helping. Been there before and they stayed there and helped over there in Cuba. Took (not clear) over there and they sunk one big ship. Sink that.

(You remember the Bismark?) Sunk it Sunk it and all died. (Tape not clear for some time) And some of them got out in life boat someway. (skips about three sentences.) They sunk that ship. (Mr. Woods is talking about the sinking of some Cuban ship, but could not be understood well enough to transcribe --mc) (subject changes to locations of Indians.) --behind.
