(No store where Atoka is.)

Just house. Oh-h. (He is telling about a place where colored people were arrested because a murder had been committed. Also, about things they could buy then.)

(Wasn't any store in Atoka. Uh-huh.)

No. No house at all.

(No house.)

Depot was about all.

(Depot was about all there was.)

Restaurant--railroad men eat. Eat at restaurant at the depot.

(At the depot.)

Yeah. They eat there and then--
