any time you have a fire at night it can go out. I can't get up before those men that's why I don't like to doctor in the tipi.

(You doctor with it when you're just outside.)

Yeah, outside or in the house.

(Do you doctor, do you fix it up any way other than just in that powder and tea or in kind of gravy.)

Yeah.

CURING CROOKED FACE AND MOUTH

(What other ways do you use it?)

You have to-that medicine be all fix up--I fix the medicine up just like you mix that peyote, you boil it. This one we get over here. And then I boiled it and then--kind of thin like water (static on tape). I drink some of it and I--when I drink some it. I pour some in my mouth and you have to, you know, rub it on that place where--you have to suck it with your mouth. Suck that place where it hurts, that crooked face--you just have to do that one.

(Yeah.)

Suck it with your mouth.

(Now this is when you have that --)

That crooked mouth.

(Well; I mean you suck that.)

Yeah. I suck that.

(When you have a hurt in your mouth you're supposed to do that.)

I have some in my mouth, then I just hold in my mouth like that and just suck it up and that thing so bitter it—the tast—you could taste it's bitter. And long as it's bitter you won't get well. But the longer you doctor them—three or four times that bitter taste come out of it. And that's when they get well. But as long as that—you suck all that foamy stuff out of it.

(Foamy?)
