We're going to record some Cherokee alphabet by Mr. Calvin Naked Head, who lives in Bell Community, out east of Stilwell, Oklahoma. We're here on this nice evening of August 14, 1967. I'm going to ask Mr. Naked Head to give me the Cherokee alphabet. So maybe I can learn a few of the symbols. Calvin if you'll go ahead and give these--

CHEROKEE SYMBOLS

Ah, ā, e, o, oo, uh. Ca, ca, ga, ee, o, goo, guh, Ha, ha, he, ho, who, huh. La, la, le, lo, lou, lah. Ma, ma, me, mo, moo. Nah, nah, nae, nee, no, new, nah. Qua, quah, que, quo, qaunt. Saw, say, see, sew, sue, saunt. Day, tah, day, t, d, t, row, do dunt. ~~Ia, cla, cle, clay, cle, clo, clue, clunt. Way, way, we, woe, woo, wunt.~~ Yah, yah, yee, yoo, you, yunt.
