(They didn't do the Blackfoot Dance, then did they?)

No. Scalp Dance or War Dance. And Brush Dance. Scalp Dance was the most popular.

(How many days did they camp there?)

About-- Boy, they come in early. Sometimes peoples come there about two weeks, I guess. Yeah, they camp--big camp. They camp there about two weeks, I guess, before the pow-wow starts. Well, the first week and second week--about four days, I guess--the pow-wow--

(Well, they call it a "pow-wow" back then?)

Yeah. Um-hum.
