Note: This interview took place at the Hog Creek Trading Post on Highway 9, west of Anadarko, run by Charles and Ruth ~~R~~ Palmer. Able lived with Mary and Charles Tartsoh, whose house was located a short distance to the south of the Palmers' trading post, but he spend much of his time visiting at the post the Charles and Ruth and their customers. ~~Charles~~ Charles Tartsoh and Charles Palmer were half-brothers. They had the same mother. On this tape Able tells field worker, Tim Baugh, a graduate student in Anthropology, a number of stories in Kiowa. These stories mostly concern the adventures of the trickster hero, Sainday. Only one story ~~next~~ is also translated on this tape, and this English version is given by Charles Palmer who was present ~~x~~ during the interview. The story given below is a transcription of Charles' translation. The rest of the stories were translated a few days after the interview with Able by Evelyn Chalepah. Her translations are given in T-72 and ~~T-3~~ T-73.

Charles Palmer died the winter of ~~1968~~ 1968-69 and the Hog Creek Trading Post was torn down shortly thereafter--J. Jordan.
