(Could you ask her if she could tell me anything about Indian doctors?)

Charlie: (Asks the question.)

Lou Ella: That man ap pay dah, and Old Man Cody, names, you know, some of them. And White Buffalo, that Carnegie White Buffalo. (Talks with Charlie in Kiowa.)

Charlie: Five of them. They get you in that..start dancing and they'll tell you what's going on in heaven. They meet their folks you know, lot of them, you know, like you got a parent pass away, well they'll tell, "We talk to them in person. Person to person spirit."

(They tell you what they said?)

Charlie: Yeah, yeah.

Lou Ella: And they believe him, you know.

(Charlie talks to Lou Ella.)

Lou Ella: I don't know just when it was it broke up, you know. His wife died that sed ap pay doe's wife died and that's time it broke up.
