run in front of them somebody's got to go and kill him, shoot him.

(How come they did that?)

I don't know. Did you ask the old man that question? He could have told you lots of things about that—but me, I don't hardly know, but just when the old man told me. That was his folks dance.

(I didn't hear about it until recently Mary Poafpybitty told me it was a crow dance but she didn't know much about it.)

, The Old man knows.

(Do you know anything about Quanah/Parker?)

QUANAH PARKER:

When I was a little girl we used to travel you know. But I just don't know where this place is. I could just know it like a dream that there's these mosquite trees all over where we're going. And we crossed some big creek & everybody help each other cross it. I don't know where we were going but I just know it just like a dream. I could remember that cause we was in a bunch with Quanah Parker's bunch and I don't know. I always thought he was a real Indian but later on I heard that he was & white.

(Which bunch was his bunch?)

I don't know what the name of the bunch is.

(What did he look like? Did you ever see him?)

Yeah, I seen him. He didn't look too white to me. He just looked like us Indians.

(Did you ever hear any stories about how he got to be famous?)

All I know is that they said he was the chief of the Comanches. That he lead the people, you know, on a trip like that going somewhere—you ask old men about that? He knows/ot about that. He says he was in the
