

of their head, they got cross on there, maybe they clan to that chief that sits in behind the cross. And then they got-but the clans that I belong I had a stars on my buckskin shirt. I had stars on both sides--on my breast and on my eagle feather I had it--it had a star on.

(How did they put the star on the eagle feather?)

Daisey: They draw it--paint it or draw it, or bead it.

Jack: That man--they had a man picked out and just whatever the chief, I mean the priest say, then they paint the cross or stars or moon. The colors are green, black--there's two colors I remember, green and yellow.

Chas: So many groups-- (speaks to Jack in Kiowa)

Jack: Oh, I don't know, just any number--any number, just like this church, you know. See, that was their religious dance, that Ghost Dance. They --I don't know what they--the words that they got in those songs are very spiritual, they got good meanings in them just like the white peoples hymns, you know, like "Amazing Grace" like that, got in the old time day schools--those kind of a bells and some got hooves--got cow hooves--((used for leg rattles)) and when that singing gets good, those women folks they get that spirit and then they get something like this Holy Rollers--you know, they think they got the spirit and then they get something and they act crazy, you know, make funny noise. Some of them falls. you know--

(This was in the Ghost Dance?)

They go with the Ghost Dance--the Ghost Dance. That's where I saw it. Cause when thats coming, my grandpa always tell me, "Go out for awhile. After awhile you come back." Them womens you know, just get some kind of a spirit in them and they act crazy and they fall--some falls in the fire too. That's the way the Ghost Dance used to be. It good, they pray good. And they pray just as good as these ministers, you know. They respect their Indian religion. But see, later after I got older, I don't know. They , there's no power to it, just--I don't know how you say, but, yeah, yeah, yea. Because I was a member of that Ghost Dance. We used to go there every summer.
