(When did he come here?)

He must of came here in around 1900, cause when I went to school, it was in 1909 and '10 and '12, I begin to hear about him--Chibato. He used to come down and he used to run meetings over here at Ben's house. After 1912 I heard he used to run meetings from Ben over here, and Ben, he took him for brother. And that's Ben's brother. According to our Indians ways. And that's where Ben got his ways. And I don't know why, but I guess I don't get in the mood, I guess. But the times' coming when I'm gonna have to sing 'em. Cause his way, it's not hard, but we just don't practice it. It's as simple as these other, but--you know, you gotta have some ~~knowledge of that way~~ where it come from--what it means. Every man that conducts meetings have an idea as to what--
