And I might add that I'm available anytime day or night, to come to any community in Cherokee country and help them do something or explain what we're doing, whatever the case may be. I think Crosslin stands ready too. We are hired but we're here with important reasons. We're here because we feel that this job needs to be done. I already told you that I have records here that you may be interested in. And I don't have a speech to give, but I am willing to explain these budgets, explain the philosophy and tell you what our involvement is in this Cherokee Indian Village and tell you what we're planning at the industrial site in Tahlequah and explain what we are doing to bring factories to this area so we can give you a job, any of these things that you are interested in. So I am going to go to a question and answer type of discussion. Whatever you are interested in, ask me. I'll try my best to answer your questions.
