(Mrs. Osborne) So, that left two widows. We were living about - we were living on my father's allotment. My mother and my father's allotment joined together, and so, when he passed away, why, my mother went with my oldest sister, and my aunt went with my uncle. Well, we all moved this way, over here where we living at the present time. And this is where we experienced all these plantings that I did with my mother. I was just about, like I said, I was about 4 years old when my father died, and we've been here on this allotment now, where my uncle used to live. In a few years, why, my aunt died, she left two boys. So my mother took the boys on over, and then she come on over here to live with my uncle. And so I lived here with my uncle and my mother for, 'til, I think it was in '21. And my uncle, he lost his wife. So, we just been on the home place, here. So my mother lived here and raised us children here with my uncle, and we all lived happy together here, and learned all our planning an preserving our Indian foods that we had to put up for the winter. And so I'm living here with my family. My husband and I are left - my children are all away from home now. But we still here, we've been here since about 1908. And so this is our home place. Have 80 acres, that we have - where we live.
