gy a tidi'e means "arms" Use your arms. gy a tidi'e — gy a. manatidi'e and zitidi'e. and gg a tidi'e. and xiztidi'e. —

(What does that mean?)

Soldier. xX is "tomahawk." "Tomahawk Legion."

(Was there an organization called the xaltidi's?)

Yes, that's soldiers. Nowadays they refer to them as these army, now. They're the same thing. The word xax is a weapon—a tomahmwk. xaxtidi . — that's . soldier, "G.I.

(What does gra, tidi's. mean?)

I think it's "arm." They use their arms. I guess it could mean you use...throw spears, you throw tomahawk...anything you throw, you use your arms.

(What does gold. by itself mean?)

That's "arm." Either one--your right or your left. Arm. "Arm Legion," you know--

(Are there any other words that you know that have that tidi'd. in it?)

Yes. (Repeats all of the above terms.) Atidi e. means "horse" catalry, like.

(Well, you were saying that this manatidie. and litidie, are sort of religious--

Well, manatidi'e. — it's like the army. If you're a member of that, you're supposed to be brave, like a hero. You go forward so you don't go backwards towards the enemy, and in whatever you undertake to do you don't back off. That's one reason that the Apaches abandoned that society. But....
