Two of them, that's the ones that's in charge of everything. Everything, even outside, you know the like the (Pawnee word) dry meat, like that, they in charge of all the food.

(What do you mean, that there were about five different people that had--)'.

That is like Old Blue Hawk.

(Oh, this is what we were talking about last night on this other tape, that there were five different people that were in possession of this doctor dance?)

Mrs. Osborne: feam. There was old Man Blue Hawk, John Blue Hawk, William Sutton, Phillip Younf, Elmer (name not clear), and that's the one that use to have that.

(And was another one that you mentioned High Eagle:)

Mrs. Osborne: Oh, way back there, High Eagle, yeah.

Yeah. Had that Whistle Dance that--that was what they ase to call that Whistle Dance.

(As you remember the deremony, now did it start and how did they proceed through the Dostor Dance:)

TWO FIREMEN TO MAKE FIRE WHEN NEEDED

Oh, they right there them two and there's two firemen over there, they help with the fire.

(What do you sall these people in Indian!)

(Answer not inderstandable). (Pawnee word) -- and they got a big pile of wood out there, well we're all in there and just the two head men tells us to watch outside, the spots getting dark a little bit and that's what they meant to tell them. To tell them the (Pawnee word) to watch out when they
