Jack: It's a good highway though—good highway to town I would think.

(Do you have any Indian families living close by?)

(Vinita—fifteen miles you went to school. Did some turkey hunting up close to where we live. Do you remember that big turkey you killed one time?)

Nancy: He said that was when you all live over here.

(Who built this house? Do you remember?)
