Mrs. Harper: And they had this meeting--called for a certain day--I was just getting ready to go.

(Is that with the Historical Society?)

No. Oh, it's a government program. Nobody showed up. I didn't know who all was invited. I was the only one there. Well, Frances Drexil came. Edward finally showed up. Dr. Reynolds, Mr. Allen and I only ones there. They called this next meeting, I was getting ready to go. I told LeRoy I wanted him to go. (next sentence not clear) And so when that day came, Rose's husband had been sick, she wanted LeRoy to pray for him--they came out and I had to stay home. Well, I never hear no more. Finally, one day I went up there, and I went to see Mr. Allen and I told him I couldn't come and I wondered what they did. He said well, he still didn't say who all showed up. It wasn't too many, I guess. He said they had the meeting. He said they got Archie to be the chairman. He said they wanted Joe Matthews, but he declined. That they'd rather have some tribal member, I guess, other tribal member. So that was the end of it. And he said, well, we'll let you know if we're going to have anything else, I mean, you know, have another meeting. And they never have, they've never written to me. I never read about it or heard about it. I guess it's just at a standstill. But I was interested in it because I thought, well, we needed something like that.
