And just to remember that not too many years ago, this vast nation of prairies and woods, plains, streams, all covered with buffalo and many wonderful things that the Indian enjoyed. And it was their land. But now today we look around us and we see that perhaps it isn't our land again...but it is our land in a sense because many of our braves have gone to - die for it and gone to fight for it, and they will be the first to step up and give their life in order to protect this land. I myself was a vertern back in World War II. We were told in that particular era, that the war would be the end to all wars; that we were fighting a battle that once and for all our children, our children's children wouldn't ever have to go to the battlefield and give his life for his country. But it seems that we've gone through three other wars now, four since that time. And if prophecy is right in the Bible, we will continue to have war as long as there are two men that stand and disagree with one another. So it's only right today to think about these things, think about the Indian, his heritage. This is his land, he's fought for it in the past, he will continue to fight for it in the future. And I'm sure that in his own way, and in time that things will be more profitable for the Indian than they are today.
