And I have created some new dimensions, I might say, and some new thought to ribbon work. I do make a very beautiful contemporary dress and trim it in the authentic ribbon design in these dresses. I have sold throughout the country. And this is a coming field in my business and I have done reproducing of articles of Indian ribbon designs for Chapell House in Denver, and I have made attire for customers in Wisconsin and Michigan, New York State, Louisiana and Indiana and California, Texas and New Mexico and it is growing all the time. I think that this is a good field for our Indian young people to pursue. Something that is practical with a very authentic touch of Indian craft connected. Also in our Redman's Store in Pawhuska, we have, we do other types of work, too. We do other dress from various tribes. We do research. We have done some work with skins in making the buckskin dresses and it's a revival of this craft which I felt was dying out in this part of the country. We had a few people who did this work but not enough to fill the demand. And right along with it, our young Indian people know that they can find the clothes to dance in and so that encourages them to participate. And also in our store, we do authentic style shows of various dresses of the various tribes. In our collection, we have about 14 fully attired dresses. And with each dress, we try to make it as authentic as possible. We have a beautiful Navajo dress with the velveteen top pleated and we have also the squaw boots like the Navajo ladies wear. And we have a Seminole dress and a Kiowa cloth dress. We have two Kiowa dresses. And naturally, we have our own Osage. We have a Pawnee lady's dress and a buckskin early, early, Chickasaw dress that we did in connection with the University of Oklahoma Library with Mrs. Alice Timmons assisting us in our research. And these styles shows have been quite popular. We have had a number in Pawhuska, and in Bartlesville, and Claremore, and we have had one in
