with her till they all got growned, baby girl I guess about 16. They finally separated
they was livin' in Mexico then, Albequerque where he lived. Next time I heard forcom
him Me was in Detroit, Michigan. So he married last November the 4th and brought his
wife down to see us. Came down here and spent a night with us, went on up to Shawnee
and spent a night with his oldest boy. Then he went back to Missouti, stayed awhile
with his mother-his mother lived in Missouri and then went on back home. And now he's
calling me, wankin me to come up there and visit him. I told him I dan't get off
right now, whenever I can I'll come up there. That's the only child I got--Cheta's
got one girl too. She's still livin' but she lives in Wewoka here, she lives right
byer the/hill here Ocheese on , no on Hitchite Street.
(Well, in 1917, were you in World War I?)
No, they exempted me.
(You were married at that time?)
was married at that time, and then besides I was a good worker, so they say,
mighty good work. I'm not lazy yet, but I just now can't stand it.
(What work were you doing then, Mr. Dean?)
I was a farmer, farming.
(Now, where is your allotment located?)
My allotment's located four miles south and two miles west of Wewoka.
(Do you still own it?)
No, I lost that during guardianship days, they had guardians--mortaged it to some
cause they gonna, send me off to school: I never did get to go anyway. Started to send
me to Boley. I/said, no, I didn't want to go to Bowley. I didn't want to go to Boley,
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I wanted to go someplace else outside of Boley. Didn't know where Boley was, didn't
