And they stick some of them through them. But most of them they just hit on the neck and cut them off. They just cut their throat off. And each one of those village camps had government-issue brass buckets and some of them buy them from Spanish traders. Large, brass buckets, bigger than these buckets --(Bigger than enamel water buckets on stove) about that big around, and a little higher, with an iron handle, you just hook over. There's some of them on exhibition at Ft. Sill Museum. You can look at them. We had one. Stumbling Bear's wife, a brass can, my wife had it. She let the Ft. Sill Museum have it. Yeah, they gave her twenty-five dollars if she'd give it to them. And she give it to them. Yeah, you'll find it.

(Yeah, I'll look for it.)

Well, anyway, the raid took place and there wasn't very many fighters there. All the menfolks was gone. Women and boys. And they were sleepy and they just kill them right and left. Some of them have their babies on their back and they chopped the neck off the woman and baby too, with her back. They're just scattered all over. There must be a hundred and fifty of them and they wipe out almost a whole village. And this old man, chief, he run
