how come it's Rose. When Dad laid it out, the town, called it Rose.

(Does this cemetery have a name over here where -?)

Yeah, they call it Elm Grove, I think.

(Elm Grove.)

SALINE COURTHOUSE - FOUR DISTRICTS

(Now is there anything deft over there at the old Saline Courthouse location?)
Yeah, there's a big stone house, a lot of it still standing.

(It is! Now from here that would be a mile -- just a mile straight east.)

Yeah, it's right up here this next section, go a mile, come back about a quarter, there's a gate there and a cattle guard. I think they've got a bad dog sign, but I don't think a dog there.

(That was Joe Wilson that run that store there, after the courthouse.), Yeah, about eight years.

(Now that courthouse for the Indian Nation, it took care of what--the Delaware District, and--?)

Yeah, there was three or four of them.

(Saline District, and Cooweescoowee.)

Yeah, I think so. There was three or four of them. Three or four districts in there.

FATHER GAVE MUCH TO THE COMMUNITY

(I guess it was a busy place then, wasn't it?)

Lots of Indians around here, and they finally got a doctor up there too. Anyway, Dad, after he laid out this little town out, then he gave a lot to have someone build a school there. (Name not clear)—built one at Salina. Built a store there and then in later years dad had a stroke (not clear). He brought in a doctor in, too, he built—that is he gave a lot for a doctor—gave a lot for a school. Our school used to be down on Red Cloud's place. First school down there—Indian school. There weren't but two or three white children that went there.
