You might see five, six, seven comin' through here on horses, scattered out. You wouldn't know what they were doin'. would be lookin' for a deer or something. And white people would--lot of them get 'fraid of them, jest scared of them. Have them damn bows and arrows..(inaudible) The Indians's smart. And lot of people jest take them to be savage. They ddidin't know what they was a doing. Then can understand.

(You bet they can.)

I'll tell you what the Indian done. They just like these damn niggers you was talkin' about. Either whites and Indians are mixed up' now, pretty bad.

(Yeah, pretty bad.)

They married all together. Well, it's just the same thing as them damn niggers...help them damn niggers out, down from the whites. But now, this civil rights business, this legal business is goin' put (inaudible) Your daddy tell you to marry in your own tribe. Now, that's what he told me. Well, they're not doing it, you know it?

Up here by, oh where the line is. They wouldn't get out of that Jim Crow car. And they shot them in there.

(Up by the state line, huh?)

JIM CROW LAW

Yes, state line. You know they used to have Jim Crow car. When they hit the Indian Territory, well, by God, them niggers had to get back in their own car. Up in Kansas they allowed them to ride together. But they blocked them off up there. I can remember that as if it was done yesterday.

(Yeah, way back about statehood, wasn't it...or right after.)
