

(Like "nɛpia", "my mother"?)

Yeah. And to your father you say, "nɛapha".

(What's the word for "fingers"?)

It's hard. "nɛ sɛ-gwɛki". "nɛma sɛ-gwɛki" means "my fingers".

(Is that all your fingers?)

Yes.

(How would you say "my finger"?)

"tɛtsisukat". It means just one.

(What's the word for "arm"?)

"nɛwɛna" Means "my arm".

(Is there a different name for your lower arm and your upper arm?)

This—your elbow is kip. "nɛkip" means "my elbow."

(So your upper arm and lower arm is all one?)

Yes. In one language. "nɛwɛna" means "my arm".

(What is the word for "head"?)

"nɛpɛpi". "My head" and still your hair is "nɛpɛpi".

(What is the word for "eye"?)

"nɛ i".

(What about both your eyes?)

"nɛɛi nɛgwɛ". "My two eyes".

(What about nose?)

"nɛna.ɛpi".

(It sounds something like "eyes". Is it the same word?)

No. "nɛna:k" means "ears".

(What about mouth?)

"nɛrɛpɛ", and the teeth is "nɛra.nɛ". And "tongue" is "nɛɛkɛ". And your feet is "nɛnape".

(What about "leg"?)

"nɛon".
