Oh, you just tell them, "I don't like you". "~~o~~omia" means "go away".

(If you just say "mia" to someone does that mean the same thing?)

"go away", yes.

(What about food. How would you say "coffee"?)

"hu.wah".

("Bread"?)

"tortia". And light bread is "paⁿ".

("Meat"?)

"~~t~~ep".

(Is that word used for ham, beef, pork or--)

Just for everything--any kind of meat. But when you want bacon, you say,

"po¹o." Means pork, any kind of pork meat.

(That word for meat, does it mean meat cooked and not cooked, just any meat?)

Just any meat any way.
