Well Stilwell was just a little old town in 1890.

(Uh-huh)

And they'd come in here. Come down here. Grove was just a few miles from there. And they had a public school out here where this cemetary is now. Old man Bill Godfery build that. He was the teacher. He was a first cousin to my brother-in-law. I

went to school out there. (Not clear). (Not-clear).

(Dwight Mission wasn't it?)

Yeah. Right down below Marble City.

(Yes sir. Seem like I've heard of Dwight Mission.)

That's south,

(Yes sir) (Who started Dwight Mission?)

I don't know. That mission at Park Hill was (not clear).

(Yes sir)

(Not clear). (Not clear). Cherokee neighborhood.

(Yes sir)

I never did hear anything about Bell school.

(Bell School. Uh- I wonder how it got it's name. Did you ever hear?)

Well I don't know that was long time ago. When I was just a boy.

They called it Bell school.

(Uh-huh)

But the government built a new schoolhouse out there. Days before the Kansas City Southern.

(Kansas City Southern)

To New Orleans.
