one daughter had everything. Boy! I mean those people are having trouble!

(Is that still going on?)

Year! They hate one another and everything, but that was her wishes

POSSIBILITY OF INDIANS BECOMING LANDLESS:

(Bonnie: What do you think is going to happen as the generations go on and on and the land gets smaller and smaller?)

I think they'll do away with it. I think......

(Bonnie: Do you think everybody's going to sell eventually? What do you think will happen to the B.I.A. then, because they handle mostly land affairs, don't they?)

Well, right now they are trying to block all they could, unless it's a real serious thing that they want to use the land for. Let's say, like if I own a piece of land, and I've got a big family, I'd have to go up there and tell them I need a home, because I've got a big family. So they'll......

(Bonnie: They don't let you sell it real easy?)

No. They won't.

(Bonnie: So if you can't sell it and it's going to get smaller and smaller and smaller-you're going to have the land and you all can't sell it?)

It'll be there--I don't know. As smart as our younger generation think they're getting, I think they'll sell all of it, and just move into the cities and buy a big home. I think before too long they'll do away with it, unless the government.....

(Bonnie: But not all the Indians are doing as well, you know, like the Kaulity's...)

Some, some.... You got down there--I went this morning down by this station (a

country filling station) down here to my uncle and aunt's. And I'm sorry to say

that I wish that the government had kept---let them keep their home. They're

pitiful.

(Bonnie: Made them keep it?)
