I don't know why—why they put that because the only thing that Yellow Wolf used to tell me, that that gets hot. I asked him if that had a meaning to it. He says, "No, sometimes they split." And sometimes it gets hot. They hold it, see, they put some right here where they hold it, because if you put tobacco in there and burn it and you get ahold of that thing, you couldn't hold it in your lips. And he said that that's why they put that sinew on there. That's what he told me. This one's got it. That's the way it's supposed to be. See, when they put it in their mouth, it's not so hot? And I see where he was making that groove, see? He could put green, red or yellow.

(Well, they put this small end in their mouth?)

In their mouth. Small. This been used--I'd like to know who. Who-ever had that, you know?

(We don't know who had that.)

They don't know, huh?

(No.')

Well, my, it looks like they ought to.

(Well, it's just like people will just have a collection of things and they don't know where they come from and they just give it all to the museum.)

I have Yellow Wolf's pipe--black one.

(Like this?)

No, not like that. A regular pipe. I took it down to Texas and one white man with a lot of money just pulled out the \$25. Never asked me or nothing. So my wife said, "You better take it." That's how come that pipe—and today they are looking for that pipe. They want it.
