and over or is it sailing in the air?)

Cecil: No, it's on the ground.

(Well now, this ring he threw up on top of the tipi, is it the same as this thing?)

Cecil: Oh, this is a game wheel. The other wheel is just a straight wheel, just like a barrel, you know. The wheel and they take that—. I'll tell you what—now I remember. They got a stick that's made cross and they use them sticks to push that wheel. See, they run and they catch that and they push it. That's just a plaything, just like a big ball. You know, you give to a child and they bounce it. Well, that's what that is.

(What's the name for that one?)

Cecil: (speaks Kiowa) game wheel

Cenny: (speaks Kiowa)

Cecil: dzaedetali kwdaedl--that's long. Dzaidetali kwdaedl.

(Dzaidetali kwdaedl?)

Cecil and Jenny: (exchange more Kiowa)

(Now that's the hoop that they push along the ground with a stick?)

Cecil: This is what they throw on the ground. And that's the game wheel, you would call it too.

(But you call that one kowdaedl.)

Cecil: No, but the other--this is called that too. They play games with it. The other one is just a plain wheel that they throw and then they run. You know how children, they got wheel--.

(It's like these hula hoops?)

Cecil: Yeah. Then they run and then they just--like they're running a (unintelligible). You see, you throw, you take a (unintelligible) and keep pushing it. Well, that's what that one was.
