Jenny: Wait, I'll ask him. (speaks Kiowa to Cecil) - a witch woman.

How would you call it in Indian.

Cecil: dwdw. I'm just going to--dwdw, then mâyî. Dwdwmâyî

Jenny: Dwdwmayi.

Cecil: Dwyomk aehî, that's a man. That's the same thing only--but

(What is that one?)

Cecil: dwdwk aehî

Jenny: Dwyómk aehî

Cecil: Dwyomk aeh?. That would be the best, yeah.

(What?)

Cecil: Dwyomk aeh . That's the same.

(Do you ever call anybody by that name?)

Cecil: That's witch woman or witch man.

(What if you said, you know I'm trying to understand a little more about the language, but how would you say, "I witch or I am witching?)

Cecil and Jenny: (Speak Kiowa together)

Cecil: Wish, she said. I wish, I wish.

Jenny: No, witch! Witch!

Cecil: Witch.

Jenny: patwgw.

Cecil: When you witch anybody patwgw, patwgw.

(Patwgw?)

Cecil: Patwgw. Patwgw
