Cecil: Dwyomk aehi, that's a man. That's the same thing only--but dwyomk aehi is a man.

(What is that one?)

Cecil: dwdwk aehi

Jenny: Dwyomk aehi

Cecil: Dwyomk aehi. That would be the best, yeah.

(What?)

Cecil: Dwyomk aehi. That's the same.

(Do you ever call anybody by that name?)

Cecil: That's witch woman or witch man.

(What if you said, you know I'm trying to understand a little more about the language, but how would you say, "I witch or I am witching?")

Cecil and Jenny: (Speak Kiowa together)

Cecil: Wish, she said. I wish, I wish.

Jenny: No, witch! Witch!

Cecil: Witch.

Jenny: patwgv.

Cecil: When you witch anybody, patwgv, patwgv.

(Patwgv?)

Cecil: Patwgv. Patwgv
